Notes:

1. ACT or SAT score reports are **not** required from new freshmen applicants who are age 21 or older by the first day of classes.
2. Special students who wish to become degree-seeking students must submit a UW System Application for Undergraduate Admission, the application fee and official educational records after completing six hours of course work before they will be permitted to enroll in additional courses.
3. If applying as a Youth Options or a High School Special Student, contact your high school for additional application requirements.
4. Beginning the first day of classes and with the instructor's permission, auditors may enroll in lecture type classes on a space-available basis. Distance Education classes are not available to auditors.
5. Unofficial transcripts may be required to prove completion of prerequisite course work.
6. If you have previously attended UW-Waukesha or another two-year UW College, this fee is exempt.

Academic Advising

Before enrolling for classes in **PRISM**, you are encouraged to meet with your academic advisor. Check your **PRISM** account to find your advisor's name.

Holds in PRISM

Many of the holds placed on student accounts in **PRISM** will prevent you from enrolling in classes. You must remove these holds before you enroll in classes.

Advance Tuition Deposit

All students are required to pay a \$100 Advance Tuition Deposit (ATD) prior to registration. The ATD is not a fee, but an advance payment applied to your tuition. The ATD is a financial commitment to pay tuition and fees.

Enrollment

Students enroll in classes and make all class schedule changes using **PRISM**. The link to **PRISM** is on the campus Web site: waukesha.uwc.edu

Early Enrollment - November 11- November 22

Degree-seeking students are eligible for Early Enrollment. You will be assigned an enrollment appointment date and time in **PRISM**. You may enroll any time after your enrollment appointment time.

Open Enrollment - Begins November 23

Students who were eligible for early enrollment can continue to enroll and change schedules. If you are a non-degree-seeking student at UW-Waukesha, you are eligible to enroll during this time.

Auditors - Enrollment begins on the first day of classes and requires faculty permission. Go to Student Services to enroll in a class as an auditor.

High School Special and Youth Options - Students enroll on a space available basis. Contact the Student Services Office for more information.

New Freshmen and Transfer Students - Information regarding Placement Testing, Advising & Registration will be mailed to all new students.

No Show Policy

If you do not attend the first class session and haven't contacted your instructor by e-mail, phone or mail, you will be dropped from the course. If you attend none of your first class sessions, you will be withdrawn from UW-Waukesha and will forfeit your \$100 Advance Tuition Deposit.

Schedule Changes

Adding a course Students may add courses until the deadline, February 7. Once the semester begins, students must have faculty permission. If you add classes after February 7, you must pay any additional tuition within 24 hours.

Dropping a course Students may drop courses until the drop deadline, **Friday, April 9**. See NOTE below.

Withdrawing means you are dropping all classes for a semester. You may withdraw through **PRISM** or by submitting a completed withdrawal form to the Student Services Office, sending a signed letter or FAX to (262) 521-5530 or sending an e-mail to WAK-Registration by using your UW-Waukesha e-mail account by the withdrawal deadline, **Friday, April 9**. The withdrawal will be effective the date the letter is postmarked or FAX or e-mail is received. See NOTE.

NOTE: The drop and withdrawal deadlines for short-term courses is different. Refer to the class schedule (pages 8-25) for specific dates.

Do not simply stop attending classes - If you enroll for classes and stop attending, you are liable for full tuition and you will receive a failing grade (F) for the class(es).

Refunds - See the Refund Schedule on page 3 or contact the Business Office at (262) 521-5441. The Advanced Tuition Deposit is not refundable after November 30, 2009.

Applying for Financial Aid

Submit the 2009-10 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible. You must apply for financial aid each year. Special students including second-degree students are not eligible. A minimum of six credits is required each semester. See the UW-Colleges site: www.uwc.edu/financial-aid/ for more information about financial aid or call Student Services at (262) 521-5040.

■ **Satisfactory Academic Progress** - A student must meet the minimum GPA and successfully complete 2/3 of the credits they attempt to keep financial aid. See the UW Colleges Web site for more information. www.uwc.edu/financial-aid/sap/

■ **Registration Deadline for Financial Aid Eligibility (Census Date)** - Financial Aid will be based upon the number of credits you are registered for on February 7, 2010, by midnight, if the UW Colleges has received your financial aid application on or before that date. **Students who add credits after February 7 will not receive additional financial aid.**

■ Most financial aid will be disbursed electronically. Students should check their account balance in PRISM to ensure tuition has been paid in full prior to February 9, 2010.

\$192.25	per credit for resident students
\$2,285.01**	full-time (12 to 18 credits) resident students
\$483.24	per credit for non-resident students
\$5,776.89**	full-time non-resident students

Fees include a \$2.00 United Council fee.

**The per credit rate (minus segregated fees) is charged for each credit over 18.

Online Course Tuition is Different

Audit-only

Audit-only students must have the instructor's permission before registering. The fee schedule for resident audit courses is \$55 per credit. Wisconsin residents age 60 or over may audit courses at no charge. However, special course fees apply. If enrolled for both credit and audit courses, all credits will be assessed at the credit rate.

Parking

Permits are required 7:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m., Monday-Friday. However, you do not need a permit to park in Lot 6 or on city streets. You can purchase an annual student parking permit at the Business Office. The cost is \$30.00.

Paying Fees – 262-521-5441

No bills are mailed to students. Please check your PRISM account for amount due.

Payment Deadline: 4:00 p.m., Friday, February 5, 2010 to set up the Partial Payment Plan.

Payment Options

1. Pay by cash or check in-person. **Make checks payable to: UW-Waukesha.** Checks may also be placed in the FEE DROP BOX located to the right of the Business Office counter. ALWAYS print your name and Student ID number on the check.
2. Pay with check by mail. Address the envelope:

Payment **must be received** by the Business Office by the payment deadline. Payments will be credited to your account the same day they are received. Check your **PRISM** account to verify a mailed check was received.
3. MasterCard and Discover **credit card payments can only be made online through PRISM.** A \$15 convenience fee will be added per payment.
4. Electronic check payments may be made online through your **PRISM** account at no additional charge.
5. **A Partial Payment Plan** is available to eligible students allowing payment to be extended over a period of time. The agreement requires a total of \$200 paid towards tuition and completion of the Credit Agreement by the tuition deadline. Download the Credit Agreement form from our website: waukesha.uwc.edu, complete it and bring it and your payment to the Business Office. A \$25 enrollment fee will be added to your account. No new Credit Agreement form is needed if you completed one in a previous semester.
6. Pell, WHEG and Stafford loans can be viewed on PRISM under the Finances. If you have pending financial aid and an unpaid balance (positive amount), you must pay the tuition balance in full by February 5 or use the Partial Payment Plan explained above.
7. A \$20 charge plus bank fees will be added to your account for checks returned for any reason. If the replacement payment is received after the payment deadline date, a \$100 Late Payment Fee will be added.

Non-payment

All students, including financial-aid recipients, must pay the tuition balance in full or enroll in the Partial Payment Plan by the payment deadline or a \$100 Late Payment Fee is charged.

Advance Tuition Deposit

All students are required to pay a \$100 Advance Tuition Deposit (ATD) prior to registration. The ATD is not a fee, but an advance payment applied to your tuition. The ATD is a financial commitment to pay tuition and fees.

Can I register without paying the ATD?

PRISM will not allow you to register until you pay the \$100 ATD. (After you pay your \$100 ATD, it may be a few hours before you can actually register in PRISM.)

The ATD is a commitment.

When you pay the ATD and register for classes you are considered financially committed to UW-Waukesha. If you want to drop all your classes, you must officially withdraw or you will owe full tuition and fees. **You will not be withdrawn for not paying your tuition.** (See schedule Changes-Withdrawing on Page 2).

Are there any exemptions?

Online students, Youth Options Program students, and Senior Auditors (60 or over) and Old Age Survivors and Disability Insurance (over 62) students are exempted. In extreme cases, students with a financial hardship may request an exemption from paying the ATD. For more information contact the Financial Aid Counselor at 262-521-5041.

How do I make a payment?

You may pay your ATD by cash, check or money order at the Business Office or by MasterCard or Discover card or by electronic check via PRISM.

Can I get a refund?

The ATD is refundable if you withdraw from all classes by Monday, November 30, 2009. If you withdraw on or after December 1, 2009, you forfeit your \$100 ATD.

The UW Colleges Distance Education (DE) program offers courses to students in these modes:

- ◆ **Compressed Video**
- ◆ **Wisline Web**
- ◆ **Computer Based Training**
- ◆ **Online**

Compressed Video: Compressed Video utilizes audio, computer, and video links simultaneously. This enables faculty and students to converse and interact with each other's coursework while viewing each other in a real time classroom setting. Note: There is a per credit technology fee for these courses.

Wisline Web: Wisline Web links an audio connection with common web-based courseware. This enables faculty and students to converse while interacting with each other's documents and graphics in a real time classroom setting.

Note: There is a per credit technology fee for these courses.

Computer Based Training: These courses are delivered to students on a course website in modules from CD-ROMS. Students complete the modules, submit their homework and correspond with the instructor via UW Colleges e-mail.

Online Information www.online.uwc.edu

In online courses, students and faculty interact totally over the Internet. Instructional courseware utilizes web pages, discussion groups, and UW Colleges e-mail. Online courses do not meet at a particular time or place, but are structured within the academic semester time frame and require class participation several times each week. These courses have different tuition, fees, and payment requirements.

About the FAST TRACK Degree Plan

The University of Wisconsin-Waukesha offers a program designed for working adults to get a start on a University of Wisconsin education without giving up jobs, family commitments or anything that has prevented you from seeking a degree. Our classes are compressed into a shorter time frame, scheduled in the evenings and attractively priced to meet your personal and financial needs.

Two mini-semesters are held within the traditional fall and spring semesters and classes are also held in between semesters (the Winterim) and in the summer. The FAST TRACK degree plan can be done at your own pace, but it is possible to complete an Associate Degree in as little as two years even by taking no more than one class at a time.
