

# LISTING OF SCHOLARSHIPS\*

## Cathy Bengtson Memorial Scholarship

For a continuing student or a student transferring to a four-year university intending to major in education, preferably math education. Preference will be given to students who have participated in the UW-Waukesha Academic Success Center programs. Recommendation from Academic Success Center staff is required.

## Jane K. Burgess Sociology Scholarship

For a continuing student with a minimum of 6 earned credits in sociology and/or anthropology. Must enroll for at least 6 credits.

## Florence B. Folkman Memorial Scholarship

For a continuing student majoring in art. A portfolio may be requested.

## John and Barbara Forrest Scholarship

For new or continuing students majoring in business or engineering and who expect to transfer to a UW System institution.

## Founding Faculty Scholarship

For an incoming freshman with a GPA of 3.5 or better or the equivalent. Available to full- and part-time students.

## Foundation Board Scholarship

For new and continuing students in any area of study. Available to full- and part-time students.

## Vincent Gleason Memorial Scholarship

For a new or continuing student who participated in any pre-college program, such as College Bound or University Camp. A high school GPA of 2.5 or higher and recommendation from his/her pre-college advisor is required.

## Rev. James E. Groppi Memorial Scholarship

For a new or continuing student with financial need who has participated in events, actions, or organizations supporting social, racial, and/or environmental justice.

## Joyce Hatteberg Connor Scholarship

For a continuing student majoring in education with a minimum of 6 earned credits and a 2.5 GPA first semester and 2.75 or higher GPA in following semesters. May be renewed for up to 3 semesters.

## Evelyn Evert Huegel Scholarship

For a new or continuing student in any area of study. Available to full- or part-time students.

## Ed Jackamonis Community Service Award

For a full- or part-time continuing student who takes an active role in serving the community at large or the UW-Waukesha community, has earned a GPA of 3.0 or higher, and plans to earn a bachelor's degree.

## Delores J. Jeuck Scholarship

For a non-traditional continuing student (male or female) who is a parent. Must take a minimum of 6 credits and have a 2.75 minimum GPA. Preference given to students pursuing a career in health-related fields.

## Marlin Johnson Scholarship

For students studying ecology, biology or the natural sciences.

## Robert Jozwiak Memorial Scholarship

For a continuing student pursuing a Bachelor's degree or higher in one of four interest areas: Journalism or Photojournalism/Photography, History, Political Science or Philosophy. Candidates should have a minimum GPA of 3.0. Preference shall be given to students demonstrating financial need.

## Mary S. Knudten Scholarship

For a high school senior graduate with a GPA of 3.75 or higher.

## Paul F. Kopshinsky Memorial Scholarship

For a new or continuing student enrolled full- or part-time with preference for students studying environmental sciences, botany, art or other disciplines related to the Field Station and outdoors.

## Karl F. & James A. Lange Memorial Scholarship

For a high school senior who graduated with a GPA of 3.5 or higher and is pursuing a degree in any of the sciences.

## Joseph & Maria Lubitz Memorial Scholarship

For a continuing student planning to enter graduate school in a health field other than a chiropractic field. Must have a 3.0 average and enroll for at least 12 credits.

## Murnan-Smith Scholarship for Single Parents

For a new or continuing student in any field of study who is a single parent. Must have a 3.0 high-school GPA or a 2.33 college GPA, whichever is more recent. Must enroll for at least 6 credits.

## Arif Naim Memorial Scholarship

For a continuing student majoring in engineering.

## Sandie Naumann Memorial Scholarship

For new and continuing students majoring in a course of study related to health care, including social work, counseling, and teaching disabled students. Must have a 2.7 GPA and enroll for at least 6 credits.

## Usha Nijasure Scholarship

For a single mother who is a continuing student in any field of study is taking a minimum of 6 credits and has shown successful completion of at least one semester of 6 or more credits and has established a 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA.

## John and Carolyn Peterson Scholarship

For students in the arts.

## John W. Rabby Scholarship

For students majoring in English who have financial need.

## Mary Savoy Roling Scholarship

For a single mother who is a new or continuing student with a 3.0 minimum GPA. Available to full- and part-time students.

## Mary Ryan Scholarship

For a continuing student majoring in education. First priority given to those majoring in physical education/athletics. Minimum GPA of 2.6 is required.

## UW-Waukesha AAU Organization Scholarship

For a new or continuing minority student who demonstrates leadership and shows a commitment to the African-American community. 2.5 GPA required.

## UW-Waukesha Foundation Scholarship

For a new or continuing student in any area of study; must enroll for 6 credits and have a minimum 2.0 GPA.

## UW-Waukesha OLLA Club Scholarship

For a continuing student who is a member of OLLA and demonstrates a commitment to the Latino community and has a minimum GPA of 2.0.

## UW-Waukesha Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

For a continuing Phi Theta Kappa member with at least 12 earned credits, a 3.5 GPA, and demonstrated service to UW-Waukesha. Contributions to PTK-supported programs and activities preferred. Must enroll for at least 6 credits.

## Waukesha Noon Rotary Scholarship

For a Waukesha County resident who is a new or continuing student attending full- or part-time in any area of study.

## Waukesha Service Club Scholarship

For a new freshman from Waukesha County in any area of study. May be renewed for up to four semesters with stipulated grade point average: 2.5 first semester; 2.75 in following semesters.

## Waukesha State Bank Scholarship

For low/moderate income or minority students in any area of study. Full- or part-time.

## Wilcox Textbook Award

For a new or continuing student in any area of study. Award is a line of credit at campus bookstore for textbook purchase.

## Women's Philanthropic Club Scholarship

For a Waukesha County resident who is a new or continuing female student over 21 who is returning to college to improve her career. Must have a 3.0 GPA or higher and enroll for at least 12 credits.

## Aubrey Wood Memorial Scholarship

For a new or continuing student majoring or minoring in chemistry or nursing or preparing for a career that requires college chemistry. Must enroll for at least 12 credits.

## Deborah Zweifel Memorial Scholarship

For a continuing student who has earned a minimum of 12 credits at UW-Waukesha and whose academic record at UW-Waukesha demonstrates significant improvement over a previous academic record.

## Philip L. Zweifel Memorial Scholarship

For a new or continuing student interested in pursuing interdisciplinary studies. Preferably focused in, but not limited to poetry, creative writing, literature, music, and/or sports.

## SCHOLARSHIPS

The UW-Waukesha Foundation funds annual scholarships for UW-Waukesha students. In addition to specific scholarship eligibility requirements, selection criteria includes the following:

- Demonstrated leadership and service

Please note that financial need is not a requirement to be considered for scholarships.

## AWARDS PROCEDURE

Scholarship applications are reviewed by the UW-Waukesha Scholarship Committee. Applicants will be notified in writing regarding the scholarship awards (usually in May).

Please note: scholarship awards are paid directly to student PRISM accounts and will be deducted from your tuition. Half of the scholarship is given each semester, unless otherwise specified.

Applicants may submit one application with supporting materials to be considered for the pool of scholarships.

- Submit two letters of recommendation (from non-relatives). One must be from a teacher or a professor. For schools using form letters, only one form letter will be accepted.
